Thanks to my children, you who grew up in the spotlight and still managed to be yourselves and follow your own passions and dreams. Thanks for putting up with it all. And then there is Fran. As is inscribed in our wedding bands, *zeh dodi v'zeh rayi*, this is my beloved and this is my friend. You have been my advisor, my cheerleader, often my memory and the rest of my gray matter, my caring critic and my fierce defender, my fashion coordinator, my conscience and inspiration, my best friend, and my love. What a blessing you are to me and to this congregation and community. Please know that all this is for you too! And I am deeply thankful to all of you who opened your hearts and allowed me to be a part of your lives in a way that no other friend or professional could. I take away all that I have experienced with you, and what we did together has become a part of who I am and will continue to be.

I conclude with some words of Torah. This week's *parsha* is a double portion, *Acharey Mot-Kedoshim*. *Acharey Mot* means "after the death," referring to the death of Aaron's sons; and *Kedoshim* means holy ones, as it says on our Torah curtain, *kedoshim tiyuy* – you shall strive to be holy ones. Implied in that pairing of *Acharey Mot / Kedoshim* is the thought that only after someone is gone do they suddenly become holy in people's minds. But we won't apply that bit of wisdom to tonight, for as the medieval character in Monty Python's movie "The Meaning of Life" said as his son was about to add him to the pile of plague-ridden corpses, "I'm not dead yet! I'm not dead yet!" There is so much life left to live, so much good which lies ahead, so many more opportunities to serve and to grow.

But the Torah I want to impart for tonight is actually from *Acharey Mot*, Leviticus 18:5, two little words which sum up all of Judaism. It says, "These are the laws and statutes one shall do *v'chai bahem*, and live by." The sages took those words, *v'chai bahem* and gave Judaism the greatest of all gifts when they said, "*chai b'hem v'lo sheyamut b'hem*, to live by them, not to die by them." For them and for each of us members of the covenant since, the sustaining and enhancing of human life has been, along with the affirmation of one God, the ultimate goal and criteria for action in Judaism. And this is the Judaism I affirm and have lived and have tried to teach and model for you. Ours is a Torah to live by, to grow by, to sing by, to dance by, to give by, to mend the world by, to hope by, to love by. *Eitz chayim hi* – our Torah is a tree of life. Its roots are our common past, its branches the acts of goodness we perform, its fruits bear the seeds of Torah that is yet to be. Cling to it! Hold fast to it! For when you do, *d'rachecha darchey noam*, your ways will be ways of happiness and joy, *v'chol netivoteha shalom* - and all the paths we have walked together and all those we have yet to walk will bring us peace!

For my food loving friends at TBO. My parting gifts to you all are the recipes we have enjoyed together for 25 years. I wish you good eating and great memories. I give to you my Kugel recipe and the Rice Rossoff recipe. *Bitayavon* which we all know, in English, means Bon Appetit!

### Fran's Noodle Kugel:

1 stick butter  
8oz cream cheese  
3/4 cup sugar  
8-12 oz extra wide egg noodles  
1 can crushed pineapple  
2 cups scalded and cooled milk  
4 eggs  
Corn flakes  
Maple syrup

Cream the butter and the cream cheese. Add sugar and then eggs, pineapple and cooled milk. Mix well. Add cooked and drained noodles. Pour into a lightly sprayed 9 X 13 pan. Top with crushed corn flakes and drizzle generously with maple syrup (light pancake syrup works well). Bake at 350 for 1 hour. Freezes well

### Rice Rossoff:

Preheat oven to 350  
8oz fine noodles raw  
1 stick of margarine (parve for the Rossoffs)  
1 can water chestnuts, sliced  
1 can stems and pieces of mushrooms  
20 oz strong chicken broth  
20 oz strong onion broth  
2 cups instant rice (uncooked)

Brown the noodles in the margarine. Place in a 2 quart round casserole. Add the rest of the ingredients. Mix gently. Bake uncovered for 1 hour. Does not freeze well but sure is good!

## Eagle Scout Project Speaks ‘Volumes’

When Eric Kahn, Boy Scout in NJ Troop 155, and TBO member, contacted Temple in search of a service project to help him achieve Eagle Scout, we gave him our most sincere *Todah Rabah* and invited him in for a meeting with Rabbi Rossoff. Rabbi shared with Eric the need to add much needed shelving to the TBO library (in the Beit Midrash).

When the library was originally designed, too much space was left in between shelves leaving many of the Temple’s books unused and inaccessible in the basement. Eric assessed the need and the resources required, and decided to dedicate his service project to building more shelves into the library’s bookcases.

In Phase I of the project, Eric and a group of Scouts worked with Rabbi Rossoff to sort and select the



books in the basement, determining which ones would be brought up to the expanded library. Phase II mainly took place in the Kahn family garage, where Eric, fellow Scouts and adult supervisors designed and constructed new shelves that were sturdy enough to support heavy

books. Phase III completed the project, by installing the new shelves – creating 1-2 additional shelves in the previous compartments – and organizing all the books by subject.

We are so grateful to Eric and his fellow Scouts from Troop 155 for making a difference at Temple and breathing new life into our treasured library. We wish him the best of luck in his quest for Eagle Scout.
