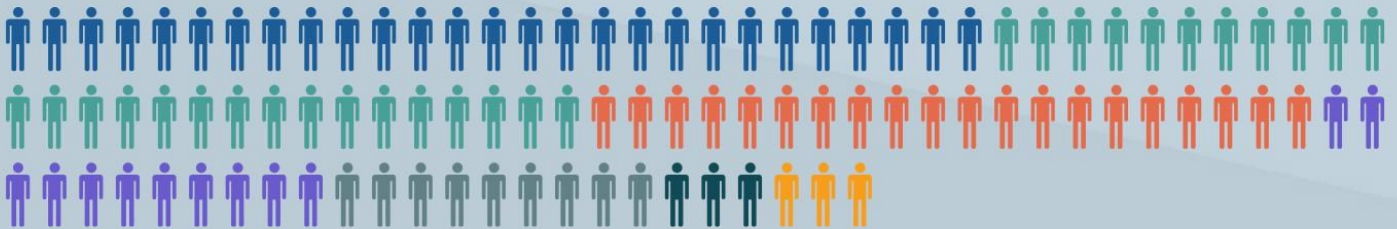

From the Rabbi....

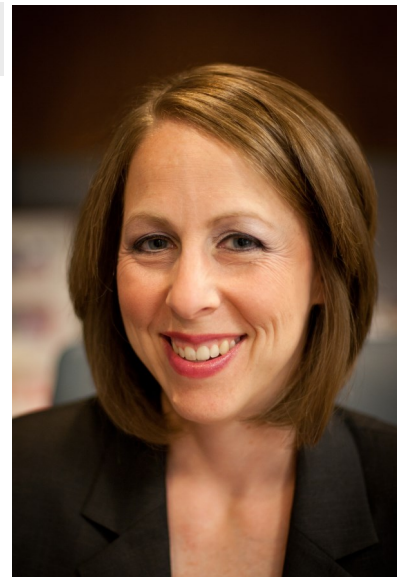
On November 7th my son, Sam was called to the Torah as a Bar Mitzvah. It was a spectacular day! A year before the Bar Mitzvah when I thought about the day I had no worries about the service piece. The celebration... well that was another story.

What was most important to me was that Sam feel celebrated, but I really did not know what that would look like. When I was getting down to the wire, and still had no plans, I decided to call a party planner. I knew she created the most amazing parties and I was hoping she could help me. After a quick conversation, she got back to me with a proposal for decorating the room. It was going to have the most incredible, beautiful, glitzy, shimmery, nightclub feel. When I imagined my guests coming into the room, I could hear them saying, "WOW! This is AMAZING...where is Sam's party?" Simply put that party was just not who we are. It did not express our values and so we passed on the proposal.

Sam's Bar Mitzvah day was exactly what we hoped it would be, and so much more. It could only be that way because it was in line with the values that we hold dear, that we try to teach our kids every day. We were surrounded by family and friends. The main focus of the day was the service, and it was deeply meaningful. The room had simple decorations with pictures of Sam on each table. From the Cantor...

And the study of Torah equals to them all because it leads to them all...

ותלמוד תורה כנגד כולם

During the long cold nights, it is our tradition to “lighten” the darkness with the lighting of candles. These flames we kindle symbolize the flame that burns inside our soul. The light in our heart and mind is kindled symbolically by this beauty every Shabbat and our season of Hanukkah. But do we truly kindle the flame that is within?

The “Enlightenment” contains within it the world light for the reason of lighting our minds and our hearts. When we fill that light, we fulfill the Mitzvah – the commandment to study Torah. The commandment to study is in the Jewish credo and is in the center of our existence as a people. We are to study for the sake of our own enlightenment and not for the achievement of a goal. In this act we achieve closeness to our God.

Luckily, our tradition and history provides us scriptures for about 1000 years of study, we have plenty to learn for at least a 100 human life times. Choice abounds...

In Amos Oz’s brilliant new book, “Jews and Words,” he speaks about the revered relationship in our history between the teacher and student – *Rabbi v’Talmid*. This relationship is the mainstay for all postbiblical Jewish literature up to modern times. He writes: “the Mishnah tellingly instructs – Make a Rabbi for yourself. Rabbis were venerated and students deeply respected. There was a deep truth to the relationship of the pair and both learned from one another. Love and admiration laced with dispute.”

And so I have listened and heard the call from my own congregation of their wishes to enlighten their souls and study. I am so excited to begin teaching an adult Hebrew Class this winter. Please join us as we connect with our most ancient language in modern times. Please contact me if you are interested in joining the class.

What does this Mishnah have to do with the comedian/actor Jim Carrey and New York Times Op-Ed contributor and author David Brooks? In my view, these individuals have each engaged their craft to tap into the essence of this essential Jewish teaching. Mr. Carrey’s film “YES MAN,” and Mr. Brooks recent book, “The Road to Character,” are both highly entertaining and poignant.

“YES MAN” is an allegory about a depressed loner whose life changes simply by saying “yes” to questions posed in his personal and work life, and embracing whatever comes next. Mr. Brooks scholarly work traces historical concept of character starting with Adam to develop the title’s literal theme – how one can respond to Life’s events and challenges by embracing change and humility and a passionate purpose. I recommend you take the time to see the film and read this book.

We Jews are a commanded tribe; God decreed that we should help repair the world by performing good acts, charity and prayer. All these things are celebrated at your shul. We have many tasks that require many hands. These tasks do not benefit the few, they benefit the many – in fact, much of what our volunteers do helps all of us. I ask you again to say YES to Temple B’nai Or, and donate your time, your talents and your capital to help our common good. I don’t ask that you finish what you start because that will be up to you. I know that when we come together as a community, the shared sense of purpose and “doing good” for others strengthens our collective and individual character. Come out and embrace your fellow Jews and share the work. We will all be better for it.
