From the Rabbi....

Mussar at Temple B'nai Or

This summer I have had the pleasure of getting to meet many of our members at the Temple, in congregants' homes, and at a diner or two. One of the beautiful things about a community our size is that we can be a community that knows each other's faces and stories. I would like to tell you a bit about my spiritual story.

Early in my rabbinic career I read an article in the late great Reform Judaism Magazine called "The Mussar Revival." It was about Reform synagogues starting groups to study and practice the Jewish spiritual path of Mussar. Mussar, meaning "discipline" or "instruction" and in Modern Hebrew "ethics," is a genre of Jewish literature stretching back to the Bible and fully flowering in the Middle Ages that explores personal virtue like humility, patience, and kindness. In the 19th Century in Lithuania came a movement to adopt this literature into concrete practices to help the individual Jew live his or her life striving to be a better *mentch*.

I love this word *mentch* because in German it simply means "human," but the Yiddish gloss is that it is a good person. Mussar is about searching our souls to see what traits, called *middot* in Hebrew, we need to strengthen and which ones we need to control. I might find through study, journaling, and meditation—all Mussar techniques—that I am very generous and kind, but I am sometimes impatient and my anger can get the better of me. Or I might find that I am humble but in some situations that call for enthusiasm, I back away. Following a Mussar path will help me bring my *middot* into balance so that I can better serve others. This is key. Mussar is not about "self-help" in the sense that you will better yourself to be more outgoing or successful, etc. It is about working on your soul so that you can live the *mitzvah* of "loving your neighbor as yourself."

So, back to the article . . . In it, I learned about Alan Morinis and his Mussar Institute and how he and others are bringing Mussar out of the ultra-Orthodox yeshiva world for the contemporary Jew. I bought his book *Everyday Holiness* and tried to bring some of the ideas and practices into my life and my preaching. My Mussar practice really started to change how I view, teach, and practice Judaism when I went to my first retreat for rabbis held by the Mussar Institute. It was there that I was trained to bring their programs to my congregation. In Toronto at Holy Blossom Temple, I created several cohorts of people who study together and support each other on their individual paths of being better *mentchen*. Many of my congregants told me how Mussar really changed their relationship to Judaism and helped them find a meaning in the synagogue. For me, I pray, my study of Mussar is helping me be a better rabbi, husband, father, and friend as I continue to work on *middot* like patience and equanimity.

I am happy to announce that we will all have the opportunity to study and practice Mussar together with the Mussar Institute program created for Reform Congregations called *Seeking Everyday Holiness*. This will be a ten-session course starting November 5 at 7:30 and will meet every other Tuesday through March 17 with a break for a few weeks in the winter. The fee will be \$50 for the book and materials, and you will have to sign up; it is not a drop-in course. I want everybody to have an opportunity to participate, so if the fee is an issue, please let me know.

I pray that this year of 5780 is a year of spiritual growth for all of us, and I hope that you join me on this Mussar journey.

From the Cantor...

(משלי ג', ו') "בכל דרכיך דעהו" **“Know God in all of your ways” (Prov.3:6)**

In the season of wonder and awe, it feels good to encounter this verse for perspective. The holidays in all their solemnity and seriousness remind us every year to awaken from our slumber of “doing.” It is an invitation to become aware, perhaps mindful of our being in the present moment, to take account of our past and future.

From our Temple home, holiness will certainly emanate as the vision of our new leadership unfolds. In a few short months, I can already see that our future feels bright and grand. Our new Rabbi be’emet fulfills the meaning of the word, which means in Hebrew “my teacher.” He is exactly that, filled with knowledge and curiosity, readily teaching in all his ways in every conversation. His generosity and calm flows out and into the rest of us as he encourages us to join him to envision and dream big so that the future of Judaism can truly be an inspiring practice filled with depth and meaning.




