Gallery Committee

The Linda Grandis Blatt Gallery of *Temple B'nai Or* was made possible in 2009 by a grant from Bill Blatt in memory of his beloved wife, Linda.

Bill's vision was to create a welcoming portal into the sacred space of the Temple, to beautify the building, and whenever possible to be a source of income.

The Gallery committee plans and manages a series of four to five exhibitions each year. The annual Members show, installed prior to the High Holidays, presents work by Temple members and their families. Other exhibits include the work of solo artists, group shows, and an annual exhibition that invites artists from the greater Morristown community. 20% of the sale of displayed artwork goes to *Temple B'nai Or*.

Committee members help recruit artists, install the exhibit, organize a reception, maintain records, and create educational programs based on the arts.
